We are now accepting manuscript submissions for the Growth and Economic Opportunities for Women (GrOW) Working Paper Series. As part of a broader initiative by IDRC and ISID, this series disseminates scholarly research on women's economic empowerment and economic growth in low-income countries, and provides a conceptual and empirical basis for policy-making. Submitting your paper to the series does not preclude you from eventually submitting your work for consideration in a scholarly journal, as you will retain full copyrights to your manuscript.

There are many benefits of submitting to the GrOW Working Paper Series in addition to contributing to GrOW's research outputs. Authors will receive:

- Support for copy-editing, including: proofreading, formatting and bibliographic checking
- Assistance with paper presentation and data visualization (i.e. standardizing tables, enhancing graphic resolution)
- The opportunity to showcase your project and research results in an online, open-access platform and get visibility before the paper appears in a scholarly journal

For authors who would like more substantive feedback on your working paper, we will send it out for double blind peer-review. Take advantage of our peer-review process to improve your future chances of success publishing in a scholarly journal. Authors who wish not to undergo external peer-review are asked to indicate in their submission to the Managing Editor where they ultimately intend to submit their paper for publication.

Paper submissions should be original "works-in-progress," aimed at stimulating public discussion of ongoing scholarly research and advancing scientific knowledge on women's economic empowerment and economic growth. We have three separate categories of working papers:

*Research Contributions:* This category is for authors who intend to submit their finished works for publication in a scholarly journal and want to benefit from our peer-review process. Research contribution papers are addressed to experts and intended to generate maximum policy uptake.

*Research Reports:* Research reports differ from research contribution papers in that they are more broadly accessible or may be more technical or descriptive in nature. This category is for authors whose papers might be journal bound, but who choose not to opt-in to our peer-review process. Authors who submit to this stream will still receive support for copy-editing, presentation and data visualization.

*Linked Papers:* This category is for existing papers that may already be published elsewhere and that authors would like featured on our website. Papers in this category require no further work and will be posted as is.

Authors are asked to indicate in which category your paper is being submitted for consideration. Accepted papers will be posted on the GrOW Research Series website and are eligible for an additional policy brief option. In order to maximize policy uptake, our editorial team will work with interested authors to generate a 2-4 page policy brief for your paper and include it on our website.
